NATIONAL PARTIES

BJP: Bharatiya Janata Party BSP: Bahujan Samaj Party CPI: Communist Party of India

CPI (M): Communist Party of India (Marxist).

INC: Indian National Congress (Congress Party)

JD(S): Janata Dal (Secular)

JD (U): Janata Dal (United)

Some Facts

- Total Seats in the Lower House (LOK SABHA) of the Parliament = 543 (Direct Election)
- Seats needed to form government = 272
- Total Size of Electorate in 1999 = 671.5 Million (1 Member of Parliament per 1.14 Million citizens)
- Total Voter Turnout = **58%**
- Average Number of Candidates per Constituency = 10
- % of Woman Candidates = 6.5%
- Total Number of States = 29 + 6 Union Territories
- Winner = Coalition "Congress and Allies"; largest coalition party INC w/ 145 seats (26.69% of National Vote) ['99 Elections: Lost, w/ 114 seats (28.30% of National Vote)]
- **Opposition** = Largest Part in opposition is the **BJP w/ 138 seats** (22.16% of National Vote) ['99 Elections: Winner, w/ 182 seats (23.75% of National Vote)]




Figure 1 – Performance of Major Political Parties ('84-'04) (Source: Election Commission of India)
